Comments from the Audience

The following were comments from the audience: 1) Pat Adams, 5618 Village Park, expressed concern that he had received a foreclosure notice on unpaid taxes. He explained the taxes had been paid by G.M.A.C.; however, an error in posting showed the taxes had already been paid; therefore, the payment for Mr. Adams' taxes were returned to G.M.A.C. At a later date it was determined the original payment was posted in error and payment removed from Mr. Adams' account. This caused there to be a delinquency in the tax payment. After discussion with the City's Tax Assessor-Collector, the error was found that the taxes had been properly paid by G.M.A.C. on 12-28-2009, but the monies were returned. Mr. Adams does not want a blemish on any future accounts. He asked that the City be more responsible when sending out foreclosure notices.

<u>Resolution Approving the Ballot for Texas Municipal League Intergovernmental Employee</u> <u>Benefits Pool Board of Trustees – TML Region 14 (six year term) DECLINED</u>

Motion was made by Councilmember Schmidt, seconded by Councilmember Adams, approving as printed a Resolution approving the Ballot for Texas Municipal League Intergovernmental Employee Benefits Pool Board of Trustees – TML Region 14. It was explained the TML Ballot would need a name prior to approval. City Attorney Pertile suggested City Council return the ballot with no vote being cast; since there was concern from City Councilmembers they were not familiar with any of the candidates. Councilmembers Schmidt and Adams withdrew their previous motion of approval. No action was taken.

Resolution No. 439 Authorizing the Mayor to sign an Amended Mutual Aid Interlocal Agreement with Fort Bend County for Fire/EMS Services for October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2012 (original Agreement approved 08-23-2010)

City Attorney Pertile explained the amendment to the original Mutual Aid Interlocal Agreement with Fort Bend County for Fire/EMS Services was the addition of the funding formula on Page 3. AP the amendment what added page 3 the funding formula. Councilmember asked if Fire/EMS Administrator Marc Jordan understood the formula. Jordan responded yes. Motion was made by Councilmember Adams, seconded by Councilmember Hughes, approving as printed a Resolution (No. 439) Authorizing the Mayor to sign an Amended Mutual Aid Interlocal Agreement with Fort Bend County for Fire/EMS Services for October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2012 (original Agreement approved 08-23-2010). All voted Aye, and the motion carried.

<u>Resolution No. 440 Approving the Moving of Uncollectible Water, Sewer and Garbage Accounts from 10-01-2003 through 09-30-2004 and Uncollectible Water, Sewer and Garbage Accounts from 10-01-2007 through 09-30-2008 to a Bad Debt Historical Account</u>

Motion was made by Councilmember Schmidt, seconded by Councilmember Adams, to approve as printed a Resolution (No. 440) approving the moving of Uncollectible Water, Sewer and Garbage Accounts from 10-01-2003 through 09-30-2004 and Uncollectible Water, Sewer and Garbage Accounts from 10-01-2007 through 09-30-2008 to a Bad Debt Historical Account. Councilmember Adams asked how City staff attempted to collect these accounts. City Treasurer Byron Hebert explained that after an account is finalized three attempts are made to collect the monies and a current list of uncollectible water, sewer and garbage accounts is maintained, so that if they attempt to open a new account the old account will appear and collection can be collected. Councilmember Adams thought there were several names that looked familiar. Councilmember Schmidt understood this to be routine clean-up. Hebert responded yes. All voted Aye, and the motion carried.

The Mayor noted the 2010 Certified Appraisal Roll had a Certified approved taxable value of \$1,073,661,322.

<u>Tax Assessor-Collector - 2010 Certified Collection Rate (100 Percent Debt Tax Collection Rate)</u> (for the record only, no action required)

The Mayor noted the 2010 Certified Collection Rate is based on 100 percent Debt Tax Collection Rate.

Motion was made by Councilmember Hughes, seconded by Councilmember Adams, approving as printed and read (caption) an Ordinance (No. 2481) Approving City of Katy's Investment Policy "City of Katy, Texas Investment Policy 2005"; Repealing all Ordinances or Parts of Ordinances in Conflict Herewith; Providing for Severability; Providing an Effective Date; Finding and Determining the Meeting this Ordinance was Passed was Open as Required By Law. City Treasurer Byron Hebert explained there were no changes to the City's Investment Policy; however, law provide for adoption each year. All voted Aye, and the motion carried.
