**Presentation – Certificate of Recognition and Appreciation to Alton Frailey, Superintendent of the Year Education Service Center Region 4**

Mayor Elder presented Alton Frailey with a certificate of recognition on being named 2010 Regional Superintendent of the Year and in appreciation of Frailey's staunch support of City projects. The Mayor said Katy ISD, under Frailey's leadership, donated approximately \$30,000.00 to Be An Angel Park, the City's barrier-free playground. **Councilmembers' Reports**



**Mayor's Reports**


